It may surprise some readers to learn that the Royal Hospital and Home for Incurables, Putney, is denied a share in the annual distribution from the King Edward's Hospital Fund and the Saturday and Sunday Collections for the Hospitals. Not one penny from these Funds ever finds its way to this Charity. The main reason for this is that the Royal Hospital for Incurables, Putney, does not cure patients, a task which it would naturally not pretend to undertake since it only accepts cases which have already been rejected as incurable by other hospitals, or by unattached members of the medical profession. Surely the fact that this hospital is denied a share in the distribution of these Funds lends added claim upon the generosity of the public.

### In Memoriam.

RATHER THAN SPEND MONEY ON THE ERECTION OF MEMORIAL STONES OR WINDOWS, WHY NOT COMMEMORATE THE PRECIOUS MEMORY OF THOSE DEAR TO YOU BY GIVING MONEY FOR NAMING IN PERPETUITY A BED, OR A WARD, AT THE ROYAL HOSPITAL AND HOME FOR INCURABLES, PUTNEY, A MEANS WHICH WOULD NOT ONLY BE A LASTING TRIBUTE TO THE DEPARTED, BUT ALSO PROVIDE THE ADDITIONAL MERIT OF AFFORDING RELIEF TO THOSE WHO ARE WORTHY OBJECTS FOR SUCH PRACTICAL SYMPATHY. A BED WILL BE NAMED IN PERPETUITY FOR THE SUM OF £1,000. A PENSION FOR AN INCURABLE WILL BE NAMED IN PERPETUITY FOR THE SUM OF £500.



TERMS OF SUBSCRIPTION.

SOME of our friends might think it appropriate if we begin this, our sixty-sixth Annual Report, with a startling statement about the voluntary hospitals and kindred institutions tottering into the arms of the State. But so much has been said and written already with reference to the failure of the voluntary system that the Board of Management of the Royal Hospital and Home for Incurables, Putney, think it desirable to give but little space here to the subject.

## Paying Patients.

Will it be necessary for the Board to seek power to take paying patients? Or will it come to deciding whether the good Samaritan or the Taxpayer is to carry on the work of looking after the Incurables? Charity has had a long and an honourable test, but now that expenses are up and public subscriptions are failing to keep pace, what is to be the outcome? Will the solution be found in the paying patient? Is the voluntary system obsolete, or are we only in the midst of a period of great and natural unsettlement? Will everything yet come right? Would State responsibility put an end to all the pressing troubles? We are on a bridge, a bridge that quivers between War and Good-will. We are passing through an interval—a restless, vivid interval. We all desire the continuation of the voluntary system, but it will be necessary for us to understand that there is more than ever an active as well as a passive side to Charity. Now is the time for strong faith and hard work.

## A Royal Visit.

Since hospital governors are exposed to special anxieties, relief would seem to point in the direction of finding compensation! And during the year just ended there was, so far as this Hospital was concerned, one great compensatory event. On May 12th Her Royal Highness the Princess Mary honoured the Institution with a visit. No formal Address was presented, but our Chairman delivered the following brief Speech of Welcome :—

“ May it please Your Royal Highness,  
 “ We, the Governors, the Treasurer, the Board  
 “ of Management, the Beneficiaries and Staff of  
 “ the Royal Hospital and Home for Incurables,  
 “ Putney, desire gratefully to acknowledge your  
 “ kindness and condescension in being present  
 “ here to-day to receive purses towards the  
 “ Nurses’ Home Fund, and to plant in the  
 “ grounds of this National Charity a tree which,  
 “ we hope, will be a flourishing memorial of your  
 “ gracious visit. The keen interest which the  
 “ Sovereign and the Royal Family have shown  
 “ in this Institution has been proved on many  
 “ occasions and gratefully appreciated. The  
 “ foundation-stone of this Assembly Room was  
 “ laid by King Edward the Seventh (when  
 “ Prince of Wales) on the seventh day of July  
 “ in the year 1879. The Royal Hospital and  
 “ Home for Incurables, Putney, was founded in  
 “ the year 1854, and it was designed to relieve  
 “ and cherish for life persons of the poorer  
 “ middle classes suffering from incurable maladies  
 “ and thereby disqualified for life’s duties. In  
 “ addition to maintaining the two hundred and  
 “ thirty in-patients, the Hospital also grants  
 “ pensions to incurables who live in their own  
 “ homes in all parts of the country. At the  
 “ present time there are 720 of these pensioners,  
 “ who regularly receive a monthly cheque from  
 “ our funds. The annual expenditure of the  
 “ Hospital exceeds £50,000, and only £8,000 of



"this sum is assured, leaving a balance of over £40,000 a year to be obtained from voluntary sources. Your Royal Highness will be interested to hear that although we are to-day dispensing with the foundation-stone laying ceremony of our new Nurses' Home, owing to the abnormally high cost of building operations, the Board have almost completed arrangements whereby two large houses in the immediate neighbourhood of the Hospital are being bought and adapted for use as a temporary Nurses' Home."

Her Royal Highness received about eighty Purses from ladies and young people towards the Nurses' Home Building Fund; a sum of over £4,000 was contained in the Purses.

The Princess afterwards made a tour of the extensive buildings and chatted with many of the bed-ridden patients.

#### Finance.

As stated in our last Annual Report, there was a debt to our Bankers on the 30th September of £7,000. The month of October brought no change in financial matters, except that the Board were still more heavily involved. It was, therefore, decided to sell out some of our slender investments. No other course appeared to be possible. Stock of the face value of over £10,000 was disposed of in order to meet current expenses. That was a bad beginning. The figures for the financial year just ended, as

compared with those for the previous twelve months, are as follows:—

On the 30th September this year our over-draft at Debt. the Bankers was £11,000—and the month's bills, amounting to over £3,000, were unpaid.

A very long Annual Report involves an undue strain on the inventive faculty, a waste of good paper and printers' labour, an excusable weariness on the part of the gentle reader. We might write twenty long paragraphs with reference to the increase in the cost of Incurables' maintenance, but the following brief comparative figures will explain all that is necessary:—

Festival  
Dinner.

On Thursday, June 12th., LORD RIDDELL presided at a Festival Dinner, held at the Savoy Hotel, in aid of the funds of the Institution. HIS LORDSHIP made a sympathetic and witty speech; he described a visit he had paid to Putney, and he made an appeal for increased financial support. Mr. THOS. W. WICKHAM (Chairman of the Board) responded.

The Rev. ARCHIBALD FLEMING, D.D. (Minister of St. Columba's, [Church of Scotland.] Pont Street), proposed "The President, Board of Management and the Dinner Stewards." In the unavoidable absence of LORD WOLVERTON, our President, Lt.-Colonel J. R. TRUSCOTT responded. Sir HORACE MARSHALL proposed "The Chairman," and congratulated LORD RIDDELL upon having raised the handsome sum of £7,500 by means of his Dinner Appeal. Sir HORACE'S speech was really an outburst of friendly feeling for an old friend, and LORD RIDDELL will forgive us if we claim that by the close of the evening such was the attitude towards him of every one of the one-hundred-and-fifty guests present. The occasion will be long remembered as one of the most successful and pleasant functions held by this Charity.

Concert.

On Thursday, April 29th, the Lord Mayor (Sir EDWARD E. COOPER) and the Lady Mayoress gave a very successful Concert at the Mansion House in aid of our funds. The programme included the names of many well-known artistes, and a large audience was present. The Lord Mayor made a

brief but touching appeal on behalf of the Incurables, and Dr. S. HENNING BELFRAGE replied on behalf of the Board. The success of the Concert was largely due to the personal efforts made by the Lady Mayoress.

The members of the Board consider themselves fortunate in having secured a valuable colleague in Major-General CHARLES MCGRIGOR, C.B., C.M.G. General MCGRIGOR'S Army record is exceptionally distinguished. After much active service with his regiment, the King's Royal Rifles, he has filled various Staff appointments, both at home and abroad, and his knowledge of administrative and organising work is varied and extensive. General MCGRIGOR will find that there is much interesting, though anxious, work before him.

The admirable work of the Ladies' Association has been carried on successfully by HER ROYAL HIGHNESS PRINCESS CHRISTIAN, the President, and by LADY LOCH, the Treasurer. The Association does much unostentatious but excellent work in befriending those candidates who are accepted by the Board and who have few, if any, friends able to help them in securing the necessary votes. The Honorary Secretary of the Association is LADY GRAY, Catherine's Lodge, Trafalgar Square, Chelsea, of whom all information concerning the Association may be obtained. The substantial financial help received from the Ladies' Association is shewn in the Balance-Sheet.

Visitors.**

The Ladies' Visiting Committee, as such, has ceased to exist, but several of the ladies who were on that Committee have become AUTHORISED VISITORS TO PATIENTS. Each Authorised Visitor has been allotted a certain number of beds, and in the occupants of these she will take a special personal interest. Any matters of complaint, irregularity, or unsatisfactory arrangements affecting the patients, will be reported by the ladies, who will from time to time send a deputation to the House Committee, which meets at the Hospital every Wednesday.

**Sale of Work.**

The Annual Sale of Inmates' Work was most kindly opened on June 8th by the Countess of Ancaster, who in a charming speech expressed her interest in its objects, wishing it all success, and largely contributing to this by her numerous purchases. The proceeds exceeded those of former years by about £100; this, however, does not represent so large a gain to the patients as it appears to do, owing to the very high prices of all materials. The beneficiaries are deeply grateful for the kindness and sympathy shown in their efforts, often made with much difficulty, and even pain, to procure the means of getting clothing and little personal necessaries so greatly needed by those whose condition requires varied methods, which can mitigate, though not remove, their sufferings.

During the year fifty new beneficiaries were elected by the votes of Subscribers, twenty-five in November and twenty-five in May. In addition to

this number one "BRODIE SEWELL" pensioner was elected last November and one "H. F. BAILEY" pensioner in May, making a total of fifty-two new beneficiaries in the year. The Board must put on record a great change which has taken place recently, so far as the nature of the benefit sought by the Incurables is concerned: formerly it was usual for five out of seven candidates to apply for the pension, whereas now the position is almost reversed—five candidates apply for ADMISSION against two who apply for the pension. Doubtless this state of affairs has been brought about by the increase in the cost of living. Pensioners now find it almost impossible to make ends meet. They look to the peace and security of a Home, at Putney, rather than incur the daily worry consequent on a small income with ever-increasing expenses.

A much-needed improvement has been effected to the North Wing of the Hospital buildings by an extension of the women patients' dining-room and the provision of additional lavatories and bath-rooms on the ground floor of the building. The women patients' main dining-room was found to be quite inadequate for its purposes, the length of the old room being 45 feet, by a width of 25 feet, and allowing seating accommodation for about seventy patients; its length has now been extended to sixty feet by the full width, and provides for seating about forty additional patients at the tables. Under this extension extra store rooms are provided in the

basement. The exterior elevation of this addition is designed to harmonise with the façade of the Hospital buildings.

The provision of the extra lavatories and bathrooms off the corridor of the North Wing supplies accommodation which has been found wanting, and will prove a great convenience to the patients and staff. These lavatories are well ventilated and commodious and conveniently placed for wheel-chair patients. The alterations and additions have been satisfactorily carried out, though considerable delay was caused by the unsettled state of the labour market and the consequent difficulty in obtaining the necessary materials. The amount of the contract entered into was £2,425, but certain additions and variations were made during the progress of the operations which will enhance the total cost.

Invitations, like crimes, depend upon motives. We invite you to visit the Royal Hospital and Home for Incurables, Putney, because you will be interested, and you will never wish to forget what you see there, and because we need your generous co-operation and your practical sympathy. The Hospital may be visited any day of the year: any week-day from two till six, and any Sunday from two till four p.m. You will not be depressed or shocked by what you see and hear; you will be brightened, gratified, surprised.

"We do not correct the man we hang; we correct others by him." We cannot cure our INCURABLES, but we can through them try and prove our thankfulness for health and activity. It is only in a civilised country that helpless invalids are provided for. Let us follow our high ideals by being generous in response to the appeal for those who are bearing the heavy yoke of incurability. Let us make life as sweet as possible for the ones who cannot struggle on without sympathy. Let us be friends and helpers of the friendless and helpless. Human fellowship counts for much, though the sharpest corners must be turned alone, Incurables stretch out their hands for love and pity and the wherewithal to make their sojourn here just endurable. LET THEM NOT ASK IN VAIN. Think of the INCURABLES and their sad lot in life.
